

Haltemprice 10k

Local athletes were spoilt for choice last weekend with 10k races at Haltemprice and Scarborough.

Beverley Athletic Club was represented in both races and the club's female runners had a particularly successful day.

In the Haltemprice 10k Carla Stansfield won the ladies' race in 39:09 and finished almost two minutes ahead of her nearest rival. Stansfield is more at home in cross-country events and this was only her fourth 10k since joining Beverley AC in July 2011 but she finished in an impressive 13th place overall.

Claire Traynor won first prize in the FV35 age category and Lucy Stamford was second. It was Stamford's first race for almost five months due to injury but she is back on form and was pleased with her performance.

Pam Atkins (below) has run this race on numerous occasions, often finishing first in her age group. She had a particularly good run this year and completed the tough hilly course in an excellent time of 56:22 to win the FV65 prize.



In the men's race Steve Peacock won 6th prize and was also the first V45 athlete to cross the line. Alan Flint won the V60 age group, Pete Fielding-Smith was second V40 and Andy Arnold was the third V50 to finish.

Andrew Wheeldon ran his first race in a Beverley vest and finished in a commendable 49:50.
