Athletes from local running clubs gathered at Great Hatfield last Sunday to take part in the Hornsea Third Marathon. The race was a designated handicap race for Beverley AC and the club fielded a squad of 28 runners.

It was a lovely spring day and conditions were perfect on the 8.74 mile course which follows rural roads around Great Hatfield.

Beverley's Carla Stansfield (left) won the ladies' race in an impressive time of 54:42. She was the fourth Beverley runner to finish and she crossed the line in fifteenth place overall. She has concentrated on cross-country running since joining Beverley last year but she is an accomplished athlete on the road and has an excellent record in the few road races that she

Dale still had an excellent run and finished more than two minutes faster than the last time she competed in this race.
